



For the second year in a row, Babson was recognized as the top U.S. college for international students in terms of quality, student population, programs of interest, and more.



240 U.S. dual citizens and 124 U.S. permanent residents make up 11% of the undergraduate and 10% of the graduate student populations.


International Students at Babson College







Gender Diversity



International Student Enrollment by Program & Gender




