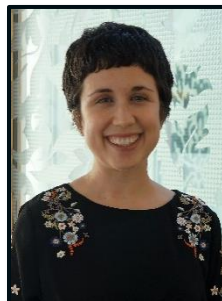

**229** U.S. dual citizens and **131** U.S. permanent residents make up **11%** of the undergraduate and **11%** of the graduate student populations.

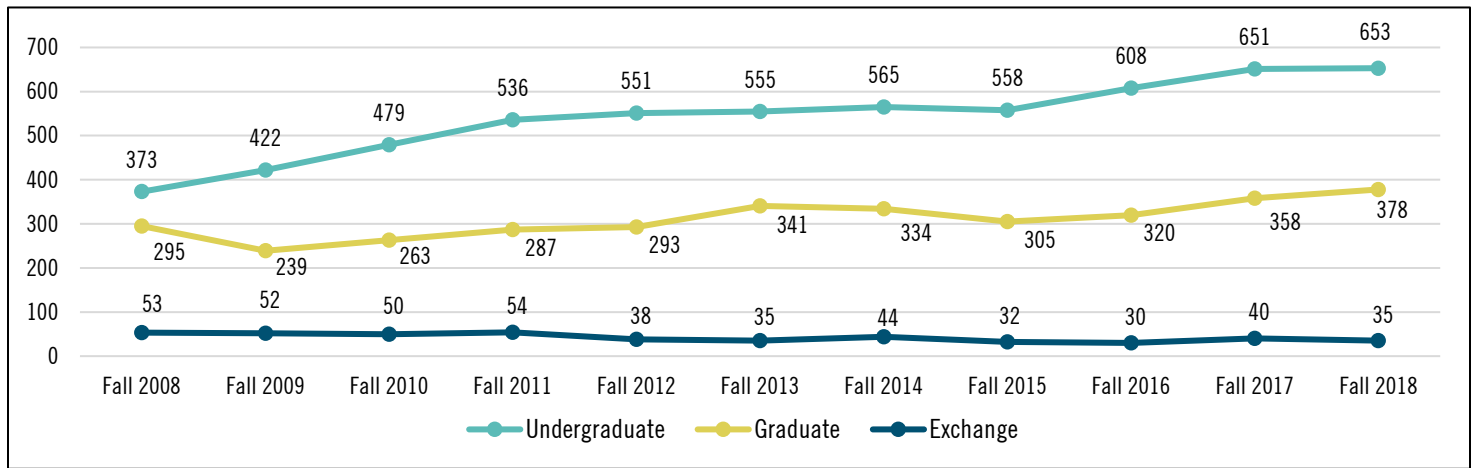

# International Student Enrollment by Program & Gender

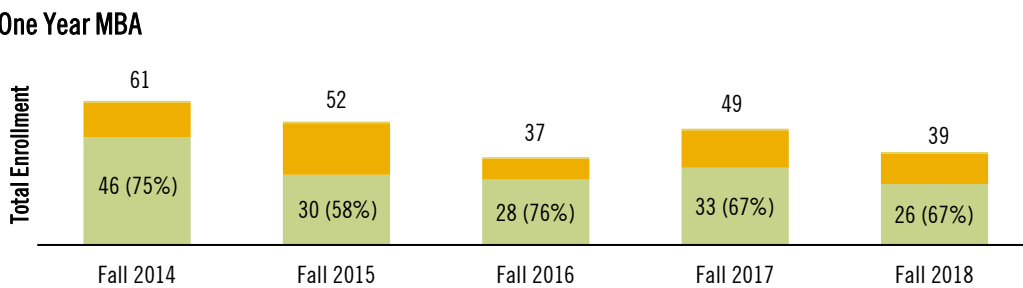

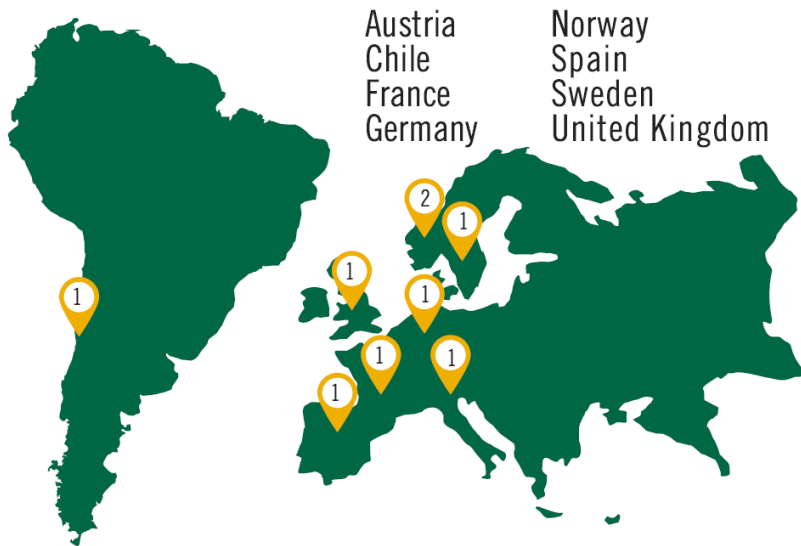
